VOLUNTEERING

It takes a lot of people power to keep things running at the farm. We need volunteers to do all the physical labor needed to keep the Rescue running smoothly and the animals well cared for. Volunteers can help with the physical needs of the horses including grooming, feeding and providing TLC or they can assist with barn chores such as cleaning stalls. We also need help with upkeep such as fence mending, painting and organization.

If you have other skills that could support the Rescue consider assisting with the newsletter, planning and working at special events and fundraisers, writing articles and helping to secure sponsorships.

Our volunteer program is designed to bring people that have a deep love and respect for horses together with horses that need love and respect. Through a series of hands-on experiences, including diet, grooming, handling, medical and dental care, round pen training and riding, our hope is that volunteers will acquire the knowledge to interact with horses in a positive manner. By learning and demonstrating levels of responsibility and knowledge, our volunteers will advance to the point of teaching others.

You'll find that we are very specific about horse care. During the hot, muggy days of summer and on the miserable, bitter cold days of winter, the horses still need to be fed, the water buckets filled, the paddocks cleaned and the medications given. If you say you'll be here, we're counting on you. On the other hand, if you just want to groom you are more than welcome to come when the weather's nice. We have a number of people that use their "grooming time" to get away from it all. Once we know that you can handle yourself safely around horses, we'll leave you alone.

I don't have much time, how can I help?

You can do a lot to help! Taking care of so many horses requires a LOT of money for feed, hay and medication. Your monthly contribution can go a long way toward covering the cost of caring for a horse or providing medications. You can also make a donation of equipment and tack. DIRECTIONS

From I-75 N:

Take I-75 North to 575 North (Exit 268). Stay on 575 until Exit 19 (Highway 20). Turn left off the exit and go east on Highway 20 for about 12 miles. Look for Free Home Elementary School and the Free Home Antiques store on the left at the intersection of Highway 20 and Ballground Road (traffic light). Turn left on Ballground Road (Highway 372) and go about 1.5-2 miles. Turn right on Newt Green Road, just past the Hawk's Ridge Golf Course. Go 2 miles on Newt Green Road to 1768. The farm is on the right and is named North Wind. It is the last farm on the right before Franklin Goldmine Road.

From GA 400N:

Take 400 North to exit 13, Bethelview (Hwy 141), turn left. Continue about 8 miles to Canton Highway/20 west. Turn left on Hwy 20 at the McDonalds/Kroger shopping center. Go 2.3 miles, then look for "Runt's Place" on right, look for right turn lane and turn right onto Franklin Goldmine Road. Go 2 miles and turn left on Newt Green Road. The farm is the first drive immediately on the left (1768 Newt Green Road)
